

Locksmiths Elect A President

Locksmith Objects To Contractor's License

The board demands all locksmiths to be contractors and anyone who refuses to comply will be forbidden to advertise in the Yellow Pages. The exception however, is that the locksmith must state "not a licensed contractor" in the ad, on cards, billboards, vans, etc. Since 98% of my business is under \$300, I am not getting a contractor's license and will turn down the 2% over \$300.

Would you please help us? We are very concerned that no one is killed because of this city's policy. We have also learned that the city is repairing locks out of one of their fire stations. Any stories, legislation, or documentation with the credentials of the person who wrote the story would help.

We will be presenting this to the City Council and the Republic and Mesa Tribune. The Council treated this problem like it was a big joke. We are hoping that a few locksmiths can make a difference and save some lives.

Happy Holidays and may the New Year bring you new challenge, reward, and satisfaction from your labors.



December's Best Tip

O.K., your appeal has finally motivated me to turn in this Technitip. It may not be typewritten, but at least I didn't write it on a cigarette pack! Actually I started to write it on a cigarette pack, but I ran out of room.

This tip has made safe opening as easy as A-B-C, and it can make it that easy for you too.

After pulling the dial and dial ring and drilling for either a scope read-



ing or a direct read, the challenge becomes to transfer the gates to the proper drop-in to open the safe. To accomplish this, I make a pencil mark at the drilled hole. This index will become the hole index. I then cut a round piece of cardboard and punch a hole in the center that will fit snugly and securely over the spindle shaft. The diameter of the disk is just large enough to reach the edge of the drilled hole. If you have trouble holding the disk to the spindle shaft, you can tape it to the back of an emergency dial or knob that is attached to the spindle stub.

The next step is to dial the lock, using the proper dialing sequence to line up each gate at the site of the hole. As the first gate is aligned, mark the disk with an "A" and a small mark that aligns with the "hole index." Then dial to the second gate, and mark the disk with a second mark and label this mark "B". If the lock is a three wheel lock, dial to the last gate and mark the disk "C" to show the location of the last gate. (See illustration 1.)

If the location of the drop-in is not known, dial to the gate in the drive cam and mark the disk with the location of the "drive cam gate." You now have the combination as A-B-C. Turn the dial slowly in the appropriate direction, to the drop-in. You should be able to feel and hear the fence, as it drops into the gate of the drive cam. Using the mark on the disk, place a mark on the face of the safe that will show the location of the drop-in.

When working on a lock of a knownmanufacturer, wherethermounting direction of the lock is known or the exact location of the drop is known, it is not necessary to locate and label the drive cam gate or transfer its location to the drop-in. Simply mark the location of the drop-in index at the proper position on the face of the safe.


After marking your dial, dial your A-B-C combination to the hole index one time to check that your turns were correct and your sight reading was straight in and not at an angle. All that remains is to dial your A-B-C combination to the drop-in index. It may be necessary to oscillate the dial at the drop-in, but the safe should open at this point. If the safe fails to open, simply place a second opening index mark (drop-in) on the safe either to the right or to the left of the first drop-in or opening index; then oscillate the dial at the drop-in. This should allow the safe to be opened. If not, mark another index and try again. Continue until the safe is opened.

This method eliminates all the math required with adding and subtracting numbers from the sight read combination, to transfer the gates around the dial to the drop-in. This is the simplified Cochran A-B-C transfer method.

This Technitip is for an easy-tomake and inexpensive method of holding lock shims. Small pieces of curved shim stock are easier to manipulate and less likely to cut your fingers when they are held in a holder or handle of some type.

To make this shim holder, you will need two key blanks with a center groove, such as the Schlage SC-6 (Ilco 1037A) and a rubber band. Photograph two shows the assembled shim

holder. The top key head is bent upwards t about a 15 degree angle. Wrap the rubber band several times near the tip of the blanks to give enough tension to hold the shim securely. Squeeze the heads of the keys together to open the tip of the holder and insert the shim.

When you're not using the shim holder, hang it on your key board. It won't get lost and the shims won't get damaged lying on your bench.


Andrew Nogaj Japan

This Technitip concerns the Armor 8" square door safe. The safe head is used as a floor type and hinged door safe. The drill point for this safe is directly under the tip of the "T" handle. The handle can be turned aside enough to allow the drill to enter. In some cases, (earlier models I think) this technique will also dodge the hardplate.


I have found that sometimes the

hardplate does not extend far enough to protect the bolt retractor bar. By drilling the head at this point, you will be able to drill off or drill and punch off the portion of the bolt retractor bar that engages the lock bolt. This will allow the handle to turn and the safe to be opened very easily.

Illustration three shows the back of the safe head with the cover removed. The handle is shown for a size comparison. Be careful, if you punch the retractor bar too hard, you will blow the lock bolt and break the lock cover off the case, requiring replacement of the lock.

If done properly, this method saves the lock and only requires welding the door and bolt retractor bar.

This Technitip concerns the modification of a pinning kit to increase your speed when working on specific (i.e., not generic) lock cylinders.


What I have done is purchase colored 1/4" self stick dots from an office supply store. They are sold to code office files.

Using the green dots, (I use green for Arrow Lock) put a dot next to the pincompartment for the correct pin length for each depth from "0" to "9." In the center of each dot, write the manufacturer's depth for that pin (i.e., 0, 1, 2, etc.). Consult the reference chart in the lid of the pin kit for the correct pins for the manufacturers you use most. You will find it a lot easier to look at the dots than always looking up to the cross reference chart to find the correct pin length for a particular depth. In my kit, the other manufacturers I have set up are Schlage (blue), Sargent (white), Kwikset (yellow), and Yale (red). There is room for three or four dots per compartment.

If you're having trouble aligning the dial ring and lock, when installing a new combination in a fire file or security cabinet, this Technitip should help you align the dial ring for a perfect fit and smooth operation.


Make an alignment tool from a dial spindle. Most of my work is with Sargent & Greenleaf 8400 series locks, so I



have used a spindle with the dial bearing on it and an old drive cam for this tool. (See illustration 4.) After installing the lock, hold the dial ring in place using the alignment tool. This will place the dial ring in perfect alignment with the lock case. After securing the dial ring to the outside of the safe door, remove the alignment tool and install the new dial and drive cam. It should operate with a perfect fit. You can then dial without turning hard or encountering tight spots caused by misalignment.

I hope this will help fellow locksmiths, as proper dial ring/lock case alignment is very important to smooth operation of the lock.

This Technitip is for the installation of a deadbolt in a travel trailer. In many cases, the inside screen door and the outside door are too close together to allow for the installation of a deadbolt, let alone allow the customer to operate the deadbolt from the inside without cutting a hole in the screen. A simple solution for this problem is to install the deadbolt in the body of the trailer beside the door rather than in the door. The deadbolt then will extend from the jamb into the door rather than from the door into the jamb. A long backset can be used to dodge any obstructions near the door and the screen door will not need to be modified. This procedure makes a neat job,

This Technitip is in reference to the horizontal lock rod manipulation tools we use, that have the wire to assist in moving the linkage. I've found that there are two things that go wrong with these great tools. The first is that the wire or pull cord breaks, and the second is that the rubber coating on the

The following is a simple and inexpensive repair and maintenance tip for these tools. An inexpensive replacement wire, which will outlast the original, can be made from nylon coated wire fishing leader material (60 lb. test). Go to your local sporting goods store and purchase a roll of leader material and a package of #62 connector sleeves. You will have enough material to make about 16 wires and still have enough

leader material to make a few fish leaders for next spring.

While you're out, buy a can of plastic dip, the material used to coat handles for a better grip. Clean the worn rubber coating off the opening tool and recoat the tool with new plastic dip. If you dip the ends of the leader wires in the plastic dip, it will seal down any sharp ends and protect your fingers.

This Technitip is for the removal of the spear head plastic clips used on the GM slide lock glove box locks that use the sidebar type lock. The front and rear plates that enclose the lock are held together by special clips. These pointed clips have four points that must be compressed to release the clip and separate the plates. If the plates are

pried apart without compressing the clips, the points can break off, ruining their holding power.

The answer to this problem is to use an \%" nut driver to compress and push the clips through the top plate. (See illustration 6.) Place the nut driver over the clip and push down. The head of the clip will be compressed and pushed through the hole in the top plate in one operation.

The code for the doors and trunk can be found easily by picking the lock using pressure on the side bar and reading the tumblers with a decoder. This method is a lot easier than removing a door or trunk lock, as these locks usually contain all six cuts for the key.

This Technitip concerns a problem I encountered in tightening the rose thimble on Corbin locks. The problem locks are in a laundry room of a hospital. Because the laundry employees were causing considerable damage to the locks by running into them with the laundry carts, I suggested that knob protectors be installed that would prevent the carts from hitting the knobs.

A block of wood was mounted under the knob, on both sides of the door. This ended the problem of damage to the knobs, but it caused another problem. Tightening the rose thimbles which secure the lock tightly to the door was impossible. The spanner wrench could not be turned completely around because of the knob protectors.

The simple solution to this problem was to drill three additional holes in the rose thimbles. The spanner hole, in the thimble, measured 3/32." Three more holes were drilled, equal distance around the thimble. The spanner can now engage the thimble at any of four positions, allowing the lockset to be tightened without removing the knob protectors.

This is a simple solution, but very effective if there is an obstruction that prevents you from tightening the spanner type rose thimbles common to Corbin, Russwin or the heavy duty Schlage locksets.

Not long ago, the only foreign locks we encountered were those on foreign automobiles or motorcycles. Educational classes began to focus on foreign automotive lock service and the trend was to learn everything that we could about foreign cars. Key blank manufacturers were quick to jump on this bandwagon and a catalog from the

early 1960's shows 183 different blanks for 91 foreign-made automobiles with locks manufactured by Huf, Nieman, Bosch and many others.

Of particular interest, is that this catalog listed only five blanks for Japanese automobiles and showed no blanks for foreign locks other than automotive locks. The foreign automobile, however, was not the only type of foreign lock that was making the scene.

By comparison, a catalog from the late 70's shows more than 200 blanks for foreign-made locks and over 1300 blanks for foreign made vehicles. Locks and lock cylinders from around the world started to appear and the challenges of service became more complex with each new arrival. We suddenly saw names like Fichet, Abloy, and a host of others and our duties started to become "international" in scope as we began to encounter locks and cylinders from just about every country in the world.

The lastest key blank catalog, March 1988, shows more than 1500 blanks for over 200 different foreign brand names, not including foreign vehicles. Many of these locks and cylinders are of high security design and require special equipment for the origination or duplication of keys.

Now, from the continent of Australia, comes yet another cylinder of high security and unique design: the BiLock, "designed by locksmiths for locksmiths."

My first encounter with the BiLock was in 1986 at the ALOA Convention in Washington D.C. where \$1000 was offered to anyone who could pick a BiLock cylinder. The lines were long as some of the best "pickers" from around the world waited for a chance to have a go at the BiLock. After three days of effort, no one walked off with the money. I was intrigued with the design of the BiLock and at the Las Vegas Convention this year, I made a special effort to learn what I could about this unusual cylinder.

The key (see photograph 1), is the




1. The BiLock key.


first thing that really catches the eye, and this is a blank that probably won't ever show up in the key blank catalogs. It might not be hard to produce, but the cutting and forming of the finished product requires some special equipment.

All BiLock systems are registered and the flow runs from the factory, in Torrence, CA, to a BiLock service center, to an authorized dealer, to a dealer. Key blanks are available from the factory only when an authorized dealer ID number is stamped into the blank before it is shipped. Keys may be cut only at the factory or at a BiLock service center. An authorized dealer may purchase unassembled cylinders and keys from the factory or a service center, may determine combinations, pin and assemble cylinders, but may not cut keys. A dealer may purchase assembled cylinders and cut keys from a service center or from the factory, but may not determine combinations, pin cylinders or cut keys.

The design and registration of a system for a dealer is controlled by a service center or by the factory. With this four level control it would seem that any system would be very well protected. The key blank in its initial form before cutting has a 90 degree shape. (See illustration 2.) Each blade of the



blank is cut separately, with a different combination, by a bench mounted clipper which automatically determines the correct spacing for each cut. (See illustration 3.) When both blades have



been cut with the proper combinations, the key is placed into a special forming press and bent into its unique "U" shape. The plastic head is then inserted into its groove and crimped firmly into place. (See illustration 4.) A DND notice appears on the head but I
















wonder about the need for this since duplication would be close to impossible without the proper equipment.


The BiLock cylinder is unusual in that there are no top pins, no master pins, and there is no shear line! The entire operating mechanism, pins, springs, spring cover (they call it a cap) and side bars are contained within a ½ plug, (see illustration 5) which, when the proper key is inserted, will turn freely within the cylinder. There are



two rows of pins, six in a row, and two side bars. (See photographs 6 & 7.)

The pin tumblers and side bars are similar to Medeco in that there are holes in the pins to accept the shafts of the side bars and the pins are chisel pointed. The similarity to Medeco stops here, however, since there are











only 15 pin tumblers used in the BiLock System; four common pins, Numbers 1-4, and 11 master pins, Numbers 5-15. All pins are the same size (see photograph 8).

The number of the pin is determined by the location and shape of the side bar shaft hole. The four common pins have a "dummy" hole, similar to Medeco, as an additional deterrent to picking. Each pin has a slot milled into the hole side in which the side bar shaft travels to keep the pin from rotating. With four depths of cut and twelve pin locations in each plug, the fifteen pins will yield about 16 million combinations. A fair batch for any system!

Resistance to drilling of the side bars is accomplished by the addition of hardened steel pins in the face of the plug. (See photograph 9.) The dual keyway (see photograph 10), and the construction of the key would seem virtually to

Dual keyway—protects against twisting.


eliminate the problem of keys breaking or twisting. Using a tensiometer we applied up to 45 pounds of torque to the head of the key several times with no apparent indication of twist. It would appear that the BiLock design incorporates several ideas from other types of cylinders, (i.e., two rows of pins, side bars, side bar shaft holes, and hardened pins to deter drilling of the side bars), into a compact and easy to assemble package.

Advertising literature states that assembly can be accomplished in less than five minutes by a person with minimal experience. We were able to achieve this time frame easily after becoming familiar with the process and a half dozen attempts.

BiLock can furnish replacement cylinders for most any application or special design and offers two types of padlocks which are rekeyable and can be master keyed to any BiLock system.

Changes and challenges are inherent in our profession and constant education and updating of skills is a necessity if we are to stay a step ahead of the criminal element. Total system control appears to be possible with the BiLock design and factory to dealer arrangement.



outlet, and didn't have Uncle Fester to plug into, but one of the guys did have a dandy little gas-powered Honda generator.


One good yank on the pull-starter was answered with a VROOOM! We were in business, and in photograph four, Downie is a-goin-for-it. In case it looks confusing, I should point out that this is a top-view photograph, taken by some nut standing on top of the safe, shouting encouragement to those brave souls on the front line. (Hey, once in a while it's fun being an armchair quarterback.) Anyway, I would be dragged into the game soon enough.

Penetration started off great. Mild steel for about an inch; copper for half an inch; and then the tough stuff. Everyone peeked in the hole and got a good look at the king of hardplates—Grade I Relsom. This is the most talked about and widely feared hardplate of all time, and for good reason. It tears up bit after bit.

We happened to be using B & A carbide tipped bits, which are of very good quality. Photograph five very clearly shows the consequences of climbing into the ring with Mr. Relsom. The bit on top is brand new; the bit on the bottom went one round and was KO'd. Understand however, that the brand does not matter. Any carbide bit, whether it be B & A, Z & Y,

A Car Opening Trick

"This article will deal with general comments on car opening with a focus on one special tool and how I modified it to work on many different cars."

As strange as it may seem, I am a locksmith as well as a safecracker. I have been in both for about 30 years now, and my family was in the locksmithing and mail order key business since 1900.

An early emphasis of my locksmithing career was in automobile servicing, foreign car key making, and lock repairs. This was at a time when foreign car work was a specialty and most information had to be gained from actual experience and from working in junkyards, pulling locks out of wrecked cars. I remember especially taking locks off Opel Kadettes (made in Germany) and being happy just to be able to get the lock off the steering column.

This article will deal with general comments on car opening with a focus on one special tool and how I modified it to work on many cars that it was not really made for. Perhaps these comments and ideas will be of benefit to others also.

Nowadays, it seems that car opening is like the early days of safe opening. Before you can open a car, one must go to a car opening book to look up the year, model, number of doors, and possibly the color of the vehicle. Next, the book will tell you the color of the tool to use, where to put it, how to turn it, whether to push up or pull down or move to the side, or even to move it forward or backward in the door. Most of the time for modern car opening is spent in researching the many books and systems available to open specific cars. The actual opening takes only seconds.






One of my favorite pastimes when called on to open cars is to try to be innovative, and try different methods, tools, and combinations of procedures. This, in the 1980's (soon to be the '90's) is quite necessary. For many years, the Slim Jim was the tool of need. Almost any car of the 1950's, 1960's, and the first part of the 1970's was able to be opened with this simple tool. In contrast now, except for some of the Chrysler line, the Slim Jim is used less because the movable pawl tailpiece is a thing of the past. There have been innovations to the Slim Jim, making it wider, longer, slotted, and hooked. All in all, it is a Slim Jim type tool, second or third generation. It is still useful, but it has fewer applications than it used to have in today's car opening arsenal of highly technological weapons.

There are several procedures that I use when I go out to open a car. The basic procedure I use is to look for the unlocking button or slide lever. If it is near the front of the car door, I will use the "J" tool as I call it, for it is shaped somewhat like a "J" if you use some imagination.

The first set of tools that I bought were HPC's Beretta-Tool and Caddy-



Killer. There are a couple of differences between these tools. Tool "A" as shown in illustration one is the Beretta-Tool, and "B," is the Caddy-Killer Tool "A' is wider and shorter than "B." The only thing that I look for when choosing either of these tools is if the door is wide with lots of padding, or thin and narrow. This is what determines what tool to use; not the name of the car that it is being used on. The wide tool cannot be used on thin doors, because the end of the tool will not contact the unlocking button. On the other hand, if you try to use the thin tool on a wide door, it cannot be pushed down without making the tool move away from the end of the tool.

When I first got these tools, the theory for their use was new to me. The way in which these tools are used is very unique and different from most other car opening tools and methods. The door is wedged away from the window near the front of the car. The bottom is then inserted into the door between the window and glass. Once the top of the tool (the upper curved portion) is below the window, it is then turned so that the top of the tool goes under the window and up on the other side of the glass, actually inside of the car. To facilitate this, sometimes it is necessary to remove the outside wedge to take off pressure on the inside window against the inside of the door. The tool can then be raised up to allow the end of the tool to go over the inside trim of the door.

The tool is then lowered to the area of the contact button, slide, or in the case of Ford products, the opening handle. The tool is manuevered into position and either the button is pressed, pulled, slid, or depressed, and the door is unlocked. When I first used these tools, they worked quite well. I had no problems, and I got a little



















overconfident.


A dealership called me to open a 1988 Buick Regal with the new type pull door handles. Since I had done a couple doors of this type before, I approached the car with confidence. Unfortunately after inserting the wide tool into the door, and locating the unlocking flipper, I found to my surprise that the tool was too short, by at least 1/4". No matter how I tried, I could not get that tool down enough to reach anything important. What is worse, I could not get the tool out of the door. The rubber edge molding on the inside of the window prevented me from taking the tool out of the door.

I then proceeded to insert the Caddy Killer into the door enough to push back the inner strip, and get the original tool out of the door. I did not pull the Caddy Killer all the way into the door above the weather stripping, so it

was easy to remove.

There were several salesmen watching me while I was extracting my first tool from the door with the second tool. They were having a good laugh at this; the locksmith that was stumped and could not get a car open.

Now in illustration two, on the left is



the original end of the tool as it came from the factory. The tool was curved back into the shape of a triangle. This allowed the end of the tool to slip over the edge of the door cover plate that is around all the unlocking and sliding buttons mounted on the edge of the door. This works quite well, and I could use the extra length in the tool curvature if I straightened it out.

I heated the tool with a small propane torch and when the metal was hot enough, I bent it into the shape on the right; that of a short "L" with an upward small end. While I was at it, I heated up the Caddy-Killer and made similar bends in it also. The purpose of the bend was so that if possible, I could

hook door handles too if need be.

I went back to the car with my modified rebent tool that was now long enough to activate the unlocking button with about 1/4" to spare. Since that time, I have not met a car or truck that I have not been able to open when I deemed it necessary to use these tools. In the modified state, they are always long enough on all the openings that I use them on.

At first, I started using these tools when all of the proper tools for the job were not working. These were my last ditch effort when-all-else-fails tools. And they always worked. Suddenly, the concept of using these tools as a first line of offensive attack started to make more and more sense to mc.

Now I use these tools before I use others. I use these tools on all cars with flipper (flapper) type locks, including the S-10 and the larger Chevy Blazers. I can use these tools on Ford Ranger pick-up trucks. The inside handle can be lifted enough from the inside edge of the door outwards to raise the inside

Although special tools are made for slide lock cars which work quite well, sometimes I like to see exactly what I Continued on page 132

Helpful Questions and Answers

Q: I need a suggestion or solution for making a key for a GM trunk, when the glove box is locked and it has a side bar, other than removing the door lock which is time consuming. A: The type of glove compartment lock which you describe is most commonly found in the General Motors luxury cars such as Cadillacs. This type of slide lock features a standard complement of six disc tumblers in the familiar side bar arrangement.

Attacking this lock can be done in one of two ways. The first method would be most desirable for those locksmiths who are adept at picking. General Motors picking tools are available and when properly utilized will open this type of glove compartment without damage. The second procedure is the one which I favor. Generally I have great success in drilling these locks.

The drilling procedure is easy.

Simply drill a 9/64" hole just above the point where the side bar can be accessed by a sharp ice pick or awl. After drilling the hole, carefully insert the ice pick in order to depress the side bar. Once pressure can be applied to the side bar the General Motors side bar disc tumbler can be easily picked and the glove compartment opened. Note: Any standard filler which hardens on contact with air can be used to fill the hole which you just drilled.

Once the cylinder is removed, the lock can be serviced in two ways. First, pick the lock to the open position while holding the side bar. Then simply use any standard decoder to decode the cuts in order to make a key. Your second option is to disassemble the

cylinder, read the tumblers, make a key and reassemble. 01

Q: We operate a busy shop and road service business. Twice in the past month we've run into complications after letting someone into "their" house. They have current ID with that address. We later find that we have let an old girlfriend, ex-roomate, exspouse etc. into the property.

As a general rule, we check the name and address on the driver's license to see if it corresponds. These have proven many times to be bogus in cases such as a previous owner, tenant, divorce, and in the case of new home owners who have not yet changed address on their ID but invariably lock themselves out. In some cases we trust that gut feeling, ask the neighbor for verification, ask for them to locate keys in the house...but what are our legal responsibilities? Are forms like an authorization form enough? Any discussion would be appreciated.

A: The question that you have posed is the one that keeps most locksmiths up nights who do service calls. The best advice that I can give you will be based on my own experience and advice from my attorney. However, before you attempt to do any service calls where the identity and motives of the customer are suspect, consult your own attorney.

Probably the most important concept to be considered in such cases is the idea of "due care." Generally speaking, this term refers to the sincere attempts on the part of the locksmith to do everything reasonable to verify the identity of the person asking for a key to his home or car. In fact, less duc care is required in emergency situations where the customer is asking the locksmith to free a child from a closed auto on a hot day or from a refrigerator. If due care is taken and the locksmith is satisfied as to the valid identity of the customer and his right to have a key made for his auto or home, then the locksmith should proceed. Remember, that in the final analysis anyone can be sued. The person doing the suing doesn't have to be right and the one being sued doesn't have to be wrong. The experience of going through the law suit can be unnerving enough even if you win.

We also use an authorization form on service calls where we face similar uncertainties. This form alone, however, cannot protect the locksmith from potential liability resulting from his actions. We ourselves have never experienced any legal fall out from these service calls because of one hard and fast rule which we always follow. If the serviceman has any doubt about this situation and the prospective customer's identity, then the locksmith has only two choices. First, require a police officer to be present at the scene or second, walk away from the service call.

Being in the state of Illinois we have a greater problem dealing with automotive work than those locksmiths in such states as California for example, where all drivers are required to carry registration, etc. In Illinois such papers beyond a driver's license alone does not identify the owner of a particular car. Even if the locksmith had the ability to run the license plates through the department of motor vehicles, this would still be inadequate information, such as in cases of a leased car where the dealer's name and not the leasee's is on the registration as owner.

The question you have posed is often impossible to answer, difficult at best! Just remember to exercise good judgment in these sticky situations at all times, request a law enforcement official whenever possible, and if worst comes to worst, don't be afraid to walk away from a service call of this nature if it makes you that uncomfortable. 01

Q: I have a job to rekey the locks in a shopping center. The doors look like the kind that have Adams-Rite locks but these locks are Armalock. The bolt is in two parts, like a telescope; one part extends out of the other part. I have taken the retainer screws out but the cylinders will not unscrew. It looks like there is a wire or something that could be holding them in. How can I get the cylinders out? Where can I get new cylinders? I messed one of them up with a pipe wrench trying to get it out. This is a big job for me. There are six doors with two cylinders on each door. Any help you can give me will be helpful.

A: Well, the first thing you need to do is get rid of the pipe wrench. This is not the type of tool that is normally found in a locksmith's tool box.

You locate the secret of cylinder

removal from Armalock locks when you saw the wires—you just didn't explore far enough. Those wires are spring clips, sort of like an auto lock retainer clip. Just pull them out and the cylinders will slip right out of the lock.

These locks will also accommodate a screw type mortise cylinder. You will be able to see the threads when you remove the cylinders. If you have to replace the damaged cylinder you can use a one inch mortise cylinder with a Yale type of cam. You will have to file the end of the cam about 1/16" in order for it to operate the Armalock mechanism. Be careful with your filing. If you take too much off it won't throw the bolt. Just file and try until you get it operating smoothly.

Thanks for writing to Shop Talk and do get rid of the pipe wrench. 03

Q: Help! I have to take the lock out of a 1978 Chevy steering wheel. My puller won't work on this one like it always has; it slips off the lock. I tried a slam hammer but it won't work either. I read where there is a retainer that you can push after you take the wheel off but I can't find it. Please send an answer quick—the fellow needs to use his car.

A: The puller you have is only effective on GM automobiles up to 1976. The design of the lock was changed for the 1977 and later models although there may be a few '77 cars with the older locks. If you will examine a pre '77 lock and a post '77 lock you will see that there is a difference in the way the "ears" are attached. On the older locks you could remove the ears, pull the lock, service it, and replace the ears. There is a puller designed for the newer type, but it is hardly worth the time and effort to use.

You really should get rid of your puller since this is the type of tool used by a thief or a repo man—not by a professional locksmith. And, also get rid of the slam hammer. You could do some real damage to the column housing which could cost a bundle to replace. Attend a class on steering column lock removal or purchase a book and study the procedures. You almost have this one whipped and I will try to tell you how to proceed.

I'll have to assume that you have removed the wheel and the turn signal mechanism. If this is correct, look


closely at the casting of the wheel housing about one inch from the steering shaft in about the one o'clock position. There is a slot in the casting which normally would reveal the black retainer on the rear of the lock body. Sometimes this slot is not all the way through the casting and you will have to break through it with the tip of a small screwdriver.

When you have broken through this thin casting membrane you will see the retainer and can feel it's spring action when you push on it. Push on the retainer and pull the lock out of the housing. If you have trouble locating this slot, take a new lock and hold it in an approximate position in relation to the assembly and you will be able to see about where the slot is located. Insert a new lock and check for proper operation before you reassemble the turn signal mechanism and replace the wheel.

When you get the fellow up and running take the money he gives you and apply it towards the purchase of a good book. Or, if you have a VCR I would recommend the GM Steering Column Video from *The National Locksmith*. It covers all GM columns to date including tilt-wheel, telescoping and the beretta.

am doing while I am doing it. These tools will not take the place of other tools, but can be used in addition to them.
